Tuesday Aug 21st 1855

This day comes in with light airs from the N.W. and cloudy ship heading Eward at sunset shortened sail weather rainy the middle part calm latter part light breezes from N.W. Ship heading Eward. The Cooper's finger is better and he is employed in cooping oil this ends. Mr Joseph of duty at noon Graciosa bore S by W about 18 miles dist no obs. Ship looking about the same as usual.

Remarks

Wednesday Aug 22^d

This day comes in with light breezes from S.W. and passing clouds at sundown shortened sail saw a schooner singly set all sail at 11 took in S.S. sails and no sail weather squally at noon more fair. saw several sail Cooper employed in cooping oil this ends. Mr Joseph of duty.

Remarks

Thursday Aug 23^d

This day comes in with fresh breeze from N.W. Ship steered N.W. at 5.45 by G. saw grampuses at 6 hrs spoke with the ship Solconda at sundown shortened sail Graciosa about 18 miles dist. S.W. and fresh breezes from the N. ship under topsails about 19 steered to the N.W. employed in putting on oil between decks saw a sail this continues. Ship between St George and Secarid. Mr Joseph of duty.

Remarks

Friday Aug 24th 1855

Comes in with fine weather and light breezes from the north steering to the S.W. employed in stowing oil between decks and continues much the same the wind from the N.W. employed in breaking for water. Thus ends. Mr Joseph of duty. Ship looking as usual.

Remarks

Saturday Aug 25th

Comes in pleasant with light from the north at 1.15 more ship to the N.W. at sundown shortened sail and continues fine ship heading to the N.W. at 8 lashed to the E. ward. all sail cut this ends. Mr Joseph of duty. Lat 39.45 N

Remarks

Sunday Aug 26th

Comes in pleasant with light winds from the N. Ship heading Eward with all sail out at sundown in S.S. sails. Pico peak bearing N.W. Dist about 30 miles. Air clear and calm. Lat 39.47 N

Remarks

Monday Aug 27th

Comes in pleasant and light breeze from the N.W. Ship heading to the N.W. one ship in sight at 12. spoke with the ship Santuck of Santuck. at 4. ship heading N. wind N.W. S. Am passed between St George and Secarid. saw grampuses. people employed in various duties. Mr Joseph the 3^d officer is put on duty again. this continues this day.
