Came with moderate breeze from the Eastward steering by the wind to the N.E. at two P.M. the wind being cut S.E. were ship to the S.W. and the weather became thick and foggy at sunset shortened sail to double reefed main topsail foresail and storm sails middle part the same at daylight made sail latter part wind light employed in cooping up oil at noon were ship to the N.E.

Came with moderate breeze from the East steering by the wind to the N.E. at sunset shortened sail to double reefed topsail and storm sails employed in cooping up oil middle part the same latter part wind hauled to the South ship laying up E by S latter part employed in stowing down

Satth May 2nd

Came with moderate breeze from the South steering by the wind to the E by South employed in stowing down at sunset finished stowing down in all about 90 bbls middle part the same at daylight made sail and stood to the Eastward latter part wind cut S.E. by E and fine clear weather employed in ship's duty saw three ships standing to the Eastward

Came with fine weather and moderate breeze from the S.E. by E ship laying up E by North at sunset shortened sail to double reefed main topsail foresail and storm sails middle part light wind from the S.W. ship laying up E by S at daylight made sail at noon steered N.E.

Came with light winds and a heavy swell from the South wind shifted course N.E. at sunset shortened sail and luffed to the wind ship heading S.E. middle part wind cut S by S at three A.M. were to the S.W. at daylight made sail at eight A.M. hauled to the S.E. by E employed in ship's duty saw five backs and four sails in sight

Came with moderate breeze from the S.E. and fine clear weather steering by the wind to the E by S at one P.M. tacked ship to the S.W. by S four sails in sight at sunset shortened sail to double reefed topsail and foresail and storm sails middle part wind worked in to the East at daylight made sail ship laying up S.E. by S saw five backs and a whaler standing to the North employed in ship's duty
