Tues Sept 2nd

Came with moderate wind and fine weather from the N. by W. course S. East and sunset shortened sail to double reefed topsail and luffed to laying up N. by East middle part raking and squally at five A.M. Kept off and steered S. E. at eight A.M. steered S. S. E. latter part blowing a moderate gale with rain squalls running under double reefed topsail and fore sail no Lat

Wedrd Sept 3rd

Came with a moderate gale and thick heavy and rainy weather from the N. N. W. running under double reefed topsail and foresail to the S. S. E. at two P.M. the wind shifted around to the North took in sail and here to laying up W. N. W. at three P.M. wind died away at five P.M. wind sprang up from the North light with heavy weather set double reefed topsail, foresail and jib ship laying up W. N. W. middle part much the same at three A.M. wind hauled to the South at four A.M. wore to the W. S. W. latter part blowing a moderate gale at noon to the E. S. E. and steered E by S wind out S. S. W.

Thursth Sept 4th

Came with a light gale from the S. S. W. steering under close reefed main topsail and foresail to the E by S, and the gale abating fast at one P.M. saw a large ship steering to the North at sunset wind quite moderate middle and latter part much the same at daylight made sail wind out S. at noon wind died away to a calm employed in ship duty

Fridth Sept 5th

Came with a calm at four P.M. a light breeze from the Westward at sunset shortened sail to double reefed main topsail and fore sail middle part wind out N. by light at daylight made sail steering E. S. E. at nine A.M. made Lord Howe's Island bearing E. by N. distant fifty miles at eleven A.M. steered from the N. by E. latter part strong breeze employed in mending sails

Satth Sept 6th

Came with strong breeze from the N. W. steering Eastward for the land, the Island bearing E. N. E. distant eleven leagues at three P.M. steered N. E. at sunset shortened sail to double reefed topsail and foresail and luffed to the wind ship laying up N. N. E. at sunset the land east end bearing S. S. E. distant ten miles, the weather looking dark and squally middle part the same latter part blowing a light gale from the W. N. W. with heavy squalls and foggy at noon saw the land bearing S. W. distant 13.5 miles N. by N.

Satth 7th Sept

Came with a heavy weather with squalls fogs and rain steering to the S. E. by S. at four P.M. wind out S. W. at sunset S. W. steering under fore sail and double reefed main topsail middle part wind moderate at daylight made sail latter part moderate breeze and clear weather at seven A.M. steered East at ten A.M. wind out W. N. W. saw humpbacks and finbacks at noon steered N. E. by E.
