Came with moderate winds from the N.W.
steering by the wind to the S.W. by W. nothing
in sight at sunset shortened sail and
were to the N.E. middle part wind out
N.E. by W. latter part blowing a light
gale ship bore to laying up N.E.
under close reefed main sail storm sail

Sun^r Sept^r 28th

Came with a moderate gale from the N.W. by W.
Ship bore to laying up N.E. under storm sail
and close reefed main sail middle part
the same at daylight wind moderated
at seven A.M. varied light from the W. steered
North and made sail saw plenty finbacks
at noon changed the course and steered N.E.
wind out S.W.

Came with light winds from the S.W.
course N.E. at five P.M. wind very
light from the South luffed to the wind
Ship laying up E.S.E. under shortened sail
saw myriads of finbacks and a jumper
middle and latter part a calm

Tues^r Sept^r 30th

Came with a calm at one P.M. slight breeze
sprang up from the N. steering by the
wind under all sail to the E.S.E. saw
finbacks at shortened sail and were
to the Westward middle part wind bore
to the N.E. by W. ship laying up W.
at daylight made sail and steered S.W.
at ten P.M. wind shifted to the N.W. by W.
ship laying up South nothing in sight

Commences with moderate winds from the
N.W. by W. steering by the wind to the South nothing
in sight at four P.M. were ship to the N.W.
at sunset shortened sail middle part the
same at daylight made sail and steered
S.W. by E. latter part wind hailed out S.W.
at noon changed the course and steered N.E.
plenty finbacks in sight employed in ship
duty

Came with moderate winds from the S.W. by W.
course N.E. employed in ship duty at five
P.M. wind out South at sunset shortened
sail and steered E. under double reefed main
sail and fore sail finbacks plenty
and the water quite green and discolored
middle the same latter part wind light
at daylight made sail and steered N.
at noon steered N.E. by E. employed in
mending sails and other necessary duties
saw finbacks and porpoises

Frid^r Oct^r 3rd

Came with winds light and fine clear weather
from the South and West course N.E. by E.
under all sail at three P.M. steered N.E.
at sunset shortened sail luffed to the wind
laying up E.S.E. employed in mending sails
nothing in sight middle part the same
latter part wind out S.W. by E. and at
daylight made sail and steered N.E. by E.
at noon steered N.W. by W. employed
in mending sails
