Came with light winds and fine clear weather from the N. W. corner N. E. at sunset shortened sail and luffed to the wind laying up to the North and West. Middle and latter part light winds and calms at daylight made sail and wore ship to the South.

Came with light winds and fine clear weather from the North saw porpoises. At sunset shortened sail and luffed to the wind ship laying up W. S. W. middle part strong breezes at daylight set double reefed topsail and foresail latter part wind out N. E. S. E. and squally with rain and wind increasing fast at noon wore ship and stood S. E.

Tues. Nov. 25th

Came with strong double reefed topsail breezes squally rainy and foggy from the N. E. S. E. corner S. E. at two P. M. took sail to double reefed m. topsail and foresail at six P. M. blowing a strong gale took in all sail to the storm sails and wore to the W. S. W. middle part gale abated some at daylight made a little sail latter part wind hauled in to the S. W. and came to anchor stronger at noon blowing a gale with squally ship laying up S. W. under double reefed m. topsail and foresail.

Wed. Nov. 26th

Came with gale with squalls from the N. W. ship lying here to under m. topsail double reefed and foresail at five P. M. wind out to the Westward took in sail to close reefed m. topsail and storm sail. ship laying up South at six P. M. wore to the North and Westward middle part gale abated at daylight made easy sail latter part wind hauled in to the S. W. ship steering by the wind to the N. W.

Came with strong double reefed topsail breezes from the S. W. and a heavy swell steering by the wind to the N. W. at sunset saw blackfish aboard took one aboard, shortened sail middle and latter part fine weather at daylight made sail and wore to the S. E. S. W. at ten A. M. wore to the W. S. W. at noon wore to the S. E.
