Friday 12th June
This day commences with fine weather
Carpenters employed coating the upper
works on lower employed painting and
various other duties lat part the same

Saturday 13th June

This day commences fine weather
Carpenters employed coating the upper
works on lower employed painting
lat part the same

Sunday 14th June

This day commences with fine weather
first part Carpenters employed coating the
ships upper works Middle part last three
men by desertion all Porters Frank & Leger
and others lat part nothing doing Sat

Monday 15th June

This day comes in with fine weather
first part nothing doing lat part Carpenters
finished Coating last two men by
desertion Messrs Clifford and John Steves

Tuesday 16th June

This day commences with fine clear
weather employed in removing the ship
from Darling Harbour Roads to the
Cove lat part employed in removing
the ship from the Cove to Neutral Bay
and scraping of Deck of her upper works

Wednesday 17th June

This day commences with Rain and
Wind nothing doing at 11 P.M. called
all hands and let go the Starboard Anchor
and gave her Both Chains at 10 A.M.
Gale increasing called all hands and sent
down the Deck and stowed the topmasts
in the tops at half past five all hands
sent down the foremast Yards and
Sheet the Mast's ship dragging 13 fms
Anchors the whole time blowing hard & rain
profusely sent at last for the steamer she got
up at twelve just intense to save us from getting on shore
