Monday June 22nd

This 24 hours I
William W. Pratt came on
Board Barque Brighton
as first Officer to serve
as such until the expiration
of two Southern Whaling seasons
and then to be discharged
at any Port the said Barque
may go furthermore to have an
Order for my voyage
men employed coopers oil
No ends this day

Tuesday June 23rd

This day eight men employed
in getting the anchor on board
Ship Connecticut also six men
on board from shore fitting rigging

Wednesday June 24th

Began with strong winds from
the W men employed
Coopers Oil last part
of the day finished making in all
the oil on board 47 casks

Thursday June 25th

This day employed in
stowing water casks
last part of the day
having 54 casks ready
to fill with water

Friday June 26th

This day the water Boat came
along side and commenced
to receive water but the
Captain ordered the Boat away
men employed in sending
up Japagallant masts
and fitting rigging so ends

Saturday June 27th

This 24 hours the crew
employed in Refitting
Rigging also 4 men
came on board from
shore that have shipped

Sunday June 28th

This day part of the
crew on shore
This day part of
the crew on shore
fine weather so ends
fine weather & no

Monday June 29th

This day five Carpenters
employed in stripping off the copper
and Sheathing and caulking
the upper works that was
left undone at the Dry Dock

Tuesday June 30th

This 24 hours the Carpenters
employed in caulking
crew employed at the rigging
