Saturday 3 commences fire all hands employed showing wave middle part last part the starboard watch on liberty so end

Sunday 4 commences fire the watch on liberty at sundown the watch came aboard middle part the same last part the starboard watch on liberty so end

Monday 5 commences fire at sunset the liberty men came aboard middle the same last part full hands employed painting ship so ends

Tuesday 6 commences fire all hands employed painting at sunset the captain came aboard with boat load of pumpkins and yams last part the same all hands employed painting so ends

Wednesday 7 commences fire all hands employed painting at sunset finished much last part all hands employed showing away so ends

Thursday 8 commences fire all hands aboard sent the boat ashore to with some provisions at sunset the boat came aboard so ends

May 11 commences fire the captain went ashore and all the men but enough to keep ship at sunset the boat came aboard at 4 P.M. the same aboard with the same mate and he men that he had ship at day wages arose and got under way light and from off shore so end

Saturday 12 commences fire with light breeze from S.W. & heading to the Northward all hands employed felling craft and taking the anchors on the bow and stowing the chains much part moderate breeze from E.S.E. heading S.E. by the N.W. under sail last part the same so a hurricane so ends

Sunday 13 commences fire with the wind from E.S.E. heading S.E. under about 1000 out flower and flags much part the same last part moderate breeze S.E. heading E by the N.W. so ends

Monday 14 commences fire with moderate breeze from S.E. heading E by the wind struck and got a fair pass much part squally at 11 A.M. took in the light sails at 12 sat 13 the men began to sail at 1 P.M. got all sail last part fire the watch employed showing up rigging
