

Bruce off Hdebra July 1849

Wednesday 11 commences fine with light breeze from S.E. heading E by N at sunset took in sails ^{at 4 1/2} and last part strong breeze at 7 backed to the Eastward so ends

Thursday 12 commences with strong breezes from S.E. heading E by the wind at sunset so strong breezes from the boats the barbed hat went along side. Darts and finished before the boats stood to S and W at sunrise backed to the E ^{at 10} whole topsails set and spanker so ends

Friday 13 commences with strong breezes from S.E. heading to the Eastward at 5 P.M. so strong breezes ran off for there did not lower bearing but sails raised topsails took in the mainsail jib and spanker which part standing first on our side and then the other last part once sail and stood to the Eastward so ends

Saturday 14 commences fine with moderate breezes from S.E. steering moderate ways in several by back at 2 P.M. so strong breezes lower the boat and last part of breeze and started to the Eastward took in sails the light sails and last part heading to S.W. shot the sails set jib and spanker so ends long 43.49 Lat 6.40

Sunday 15 commences cloudy with moderate breezes from S.E. heading to S and W at sunset took in sails for the light and W side ship heading to Eastward with and last part cloudy with moderate breeze set whole topsails jib and spanker so ends

Monday 16 commences cloudy and squally with strong breezes from S.E. heading E by the wind at sunset whole reefs fished the mainsail jib and spanker with part squally last part set whole topsails jib and spanker fine weather so ends lat 6.20 long 46.42 E

Tuesday 17 commences fine with moderate breezes from S.E. heading E by the wind at sunset whole reefs fished the jib and spanker at 11 P.M. so strong breezes and backed at the corner of half past one set them again last part strong breezes heading to the Eastward so ends

Wednesday 18 commences cloudy with moderate breezes from S.E. heading to Eastward so strong breezes windward at sunset whole reefs fished the jib and spanker at 8 P.M. were ship at 2 P.M. were squally last part gales from S.E. heading to Eastward so ends lat 6.40 long 46.44
