

At 3 P.M. looked to the S.W. and
left with it with a view to see
the above mentioned and in sight of
us. At 4.00 P.M. they were seen.

March 18. Commenced from
St. John's at 10 AM. and in the
shape of a fan, with the right side
a bit more rounded. Left St. John's at
10 AM. and commenced sailing
at 11 AM. at 11 PM started the
marks at daylight so white water on
the left. Lat 34.8 S. Long 68.6 E.

Quarrying 10 courses fine with light
layers fine at 14 ft. ending in light
at 15 ft. packed to the top of fine
mud. drilling at 8 ft. finished over
washed out the socket middle fine at 14 ft.
No more ship to at E at 5 more ship to
S 48° later fine weather so ends lat 28, 27

Wednesday 19 courses Steady with light
winds from S.W. at 4 PM took
signals heading S.W. at sunset took
on sail for the night with square

sail fine weather heading to S.W.
so much both at 10 AM long 3 1/2

Thursday 18 commences fine with light
Breezes from NW heading S & W. 1-10
No freshets at sunset took in the light
is vivid and last fine at 1.40 PM. Tacked
Sail to N. at 3 PM. Tacked to the SW
in evens lat 4³³ Long 47.18 E

Friday 19 commences fine with light
breeze from NW heading S by W under
all sail middle of last part light arises
from S^W shifted heading W by N so
fine breeze so ends lat 36° 06' S long 87° 23' E

Saturday 26 commences fine with light and
breeze. Left bearing N by E at 1 PM and
more than covered the boats but as there was
middle of last fine light breeze from
steering N by E 20 minutes, sounds

Sunday 21. Callos 46 S. Long 86.80 E
 from S. S. E. compass rose with light over
 at night - set a sharp father, over the
 island, at first fire the ship in sight.

Monday the 22 commences here with
light breezes from S E stirring to the
at 4 PM sent about ashore to
Island after the bowl & bags, middle
& lost the same the 2nd ashore
alt 250 S long 55 39 E
