

64 Thursday 7 commences with strong winds from S.E. steering N under all sail at 10 took in the light sails and stowed N.E. by 11 at 10 PM pulled up the topsail for the mainmast last part strong gales from S.E. pulled the fore topsail at 11 AM set it again so ends steering N.E. by N

Friday 10 commences with strong breezes from S.E. sailed to the wind heading to the Eastward closed up the fore topsail having spars at 4 PM set it again at sunset hoisted the fore topsail middle of last squally pulled up the foresail & down the main topsail at daylight set whole topsails so ends batt 5 48 S

Saturday 11 commences with strong winds from S.E. heading N.E. under all sail pulled up the middle of last heavy squally lying by 2 PM pulled up main topsail so ends

Sunday 12 commences with heavy gales from S.E. heading N.E. under close reefed main topsail & main spencer and hoisted the war boat up to the deck middle of last strong gales from S.E. heading to E.N.E. under close reefed main topsail fore sail & main spencer so ends

Monday 13 commences with strong gales from S.E. with strong sea heading E.N.E. under close reefed topsail foresail & mainmast middle of last light breezes from S.E. & sang at daylight made all sail heading E.N.E. so ends batt 4 46 E

Tuesday 14 commences with light breezes from S.E. & strong weather under all sail heading E.N.E. at sunset took in sail for the night middle of last squally at daylight set whole topsails so ends batt 5 15 S long

Wednesday 15 commences with light winds from S.E. heading E.N.E. by the wind at sunset took in sail for the night middle of last part light winds at daylight made all sail batt 3 45

Thursday 16 commences with light winds from S.E. heading E.N.E. under all sail at sunset took in the foretop gallantail middle of last fine under all sail heading E.S.E. so ends batt 3 10 S long

Friday 17 commences with light air from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail middle of last the same all hands employed stowing down oil so ends
