Friday 18 commences fine & calm so a fair start
middle & last the same the land in sight bearing
N by E distance 17 miles so ends

Saturday 19 commences fine & calm middle & last the
same so fair start the land in sight bearing N by E
distance 30 miles so ends

Sunday 20 commences calm with fine weather
so fair start middle & last the same with light airs
from the E heading N so ends

Monday 21 commences fine with light airs from the
Eastward heading to Northward so fair start middle & last
light airs from Eastward heading to North so black fish

Tuesday 22 commences with fine weather and light airs from
the Eastward heading to North middle & last the same at 12 PM
distance 35 miles middle part the same at 12 PM black fish
SE at 3 PM black fish to S so fair start fair start in sight

Wednesday 23 commences fine with light airs from the
S W steering to N E the land in sight distance 15
miles middle and last calm the land in sight so ends

Thursday 24 commences fine with light airs from the
S W steering to N E middle & last the same the land in sight
distance 20 miles so ends

Friday 25 commences fine with light airs from
S W steering to N E middle & last the same with light
airs from the W steering to S E under all sail the land in sight
bearing N distance 25 miles so ends

Saturday 26 commences fine with light winds from the
steering to N E at sunset set off E under all sail
middle & last the same at daylight steered N
by S so black fish so ends

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Sunday 27 commences fine with light winds from
the S W steering to N E by E the land in sight bearing
N by E distance 25 miles middle and last the same light winds
from the S steering to N E under all sail so ends lat 16 34 N

Monday 28 commences with light W steering to N E
middle & last the same the land in sight bearing N distance 18 miles and last
fine breeze from the S W steering to N E so ends lat 16 45 N

Tuesday 29 commences fine light winds from S W steering
to N E at 1 PM saw the Islands middle & last the same
steered W

Wednesday 30 commences fine with the wind from
the S W steering to Eastward the Islands in sight
at dark fine breeze W N W distance 15 miles latter
part light airs from the S heading to N two sails in
sight so ends

Thursday 31 calm weather two sails in sight so black
fish the land in sight bearing N N W distance 15 miles
middle and last the same two sails in sight so ends

November 1 1850

Friday 1 commences calm two sails in sight at
1 PM gained with the Willimokott of Haren 650
and the Dove of New London 14 months out 500 bbls
ofpt later part calm weather so several
schools of porpoises & grampas so ends

Saturday 2 commences fine with variable winds
from the S & Eastward three sails in sight
the land in sight bearing N N W distance about 20 miles
about 9 PM a man fell over board lowered a
boat and picked him up latter part light
winds from N E land in sight so ends
