 Remarks on board Monday June 10th
 fine beautiful weather wind light from the N.E.
 Barque heading E.S.E. by the wind after breakfast
 sent out the fore jib boom bent the sail & set
 up the rigging latter part the watch variously
 employed in sundry jobs Lat by obs 27° 55' S
 Long by Chronometer 45° 55' W

Tuesday ^{the} 11th commenced with gentle breezes from the N.E.
 1873 Barque heading N by W & S.W. the watch employed
 moving wood from the fore peak in to the after
 hold. At 10 in the evening wind came in to the
 Eastward steered N.W. & S.W. course latter part the
 watch variously employed in ship's duty.
 Lat by obs 26° 55' S
 Long by Chron 52° 20' W

 Remarks on board Wednesday April ^{the} 12th 1873
 pleasant breeze from the Eastward & fine beautiful weather
 to take care of a whale in should it please Providence
 to have us with me; saw one shoal of Porpoises in the
 after noon & some ship Jack latter part the watch employed
 in repairing of spare topsail for the want of better employment
 out. I hope they will come soon.

 Long by Chron 50° 20' W

Thursday ^{the} 13th 1873 light breezes from the Eastward course N.E. by S.
 Barque heading up N.W. & the watch employed
 as yesterday with the exception of getting out some
 flour & starting a but of water; Capt employed
 in turning beam trawl.
 Lat by obs 23° 35' S
 Long by Chron 52° 28' W

Friday ^{the} 14th commenced with light baffling breezes; at 2 P.M.
 finished mending the topsail & set up the bobstay
 after breakfast commenced setting up the rest
 of the rigging finished all but the Star board jib
 guy; caten through the night; latter part
 light ~~light~~ breeze from the Northward course of E
 so ends these 24 hours.
 Lat by obs 23° 36' S
 Long by Chron 52° 36' W

Saturday ^{the} 15th commenced with light breezes from the Westward
 course N.E. raised a Spout in the after noon
 run for it but saw nothing more; at 11 in the
 evening wind came in to the S.W. at 6 P.M. we
 got the topmast studding boards on the yard
 after breakfast set the sail & some time raised
 a sail standing in the Eastern tack saw Grampus
 set in the fore noon Lat by obs 22° 25' S
 Long 52° 15' W
