

Barge Burnett towards the Western Ground
 Thursday commenced with brisk breezes from the ESE steering N by E
 June 1st after dinner stowed down about 12 bbls of sperm oil
 1843 sat up some of the head rigging: at 7 AM raised a School
 of Black Fish lowered two Boats got on to the W side Boat
 and missed on to the Starboard: at 10 came along side took
 up the Boats hove in the Fish squared in the yards
 and kept off N by E so ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 00 48.5
 Long by Chro 20 18 W

Friday June 2nd commenced with fresh breezes from the ESE steering
 1843 N by E missed the Whubber at 4 AM raised a Tin Back
 going quick to the windward at 8 in the evening Edward
 Heron had a severe attack of the Cholic which lasted about
 two hours: about 2 in the morning crossed the Equator
 in the Longitude of 2100 W got in North Latitude once more
 latter part the watch variously employed in Ships
 duty: at 11 AM raised a Sail from the mast head
 Standing towards us hope she is from home and full
 of news

 Long by Chro 22 00 W

Saturday June 3rd commenced with fresh trades steering N by E
 1843 after dinner sat the works again: at 1 PM exchanged
 the Boat signals with an English Barge standing to the
 N by E: at 4 finished boiling: at sunset altered the
 course to W by N to avoid Cassers breakers: at daylight
 kept off N by E at 10 AM saw Black Fish after some
 difficulty made out two more two Boats: got on to the
 Waste Boat and struck the 20 on the iron drum
 at noon came along side hoisted up the Boats
 hove in the fish and kept off the course again
 so ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 2 00 N
 Long by Chro 24 10 W

 Sunday June 4th first and middle part strong trades steering N by E
 no less than seven of our crew and the sick list
 at night put the Cook and steward on the watches:
 saw 5 Brig to the windward latter part light breezes
 from the Southward: the SE trades are about leaving
 us: however I hope we shall soon get the NE trades
 so ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 4 01 N
 Long by Chro 24 40 W

Monday June 5th commenced with light breezes from the SE steering
 43 Was a coarse middle part strong breezes and cloudy: at 4 AM
 sat in for a regular rain storm took in the light sails
 at 8 AM took a heavy squall from the NE with copious
 showers at 11 lighted up sat the light sails again: sent
 on man at the mast head: saw one killer going quick
 latter part wind light and variable so ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 5 00 N
 Long by Chro 24 30 W

Tuesday June 6th light air from the SE course N at noon raised a
 1849 Sail ahead: hoisted out out the Black Fish whubber
 in the afternoon at 6 AM hoisted a Portugee
 from Lisbon's bound to the Brasrill gave the her
 some oil and got some sugar in return latter part
 the watch variously employed: E Heron on duty
 again Liba Fisher getting better
 Lat in 5 18 N
 Long by Chro 24 33 W
