

Barque Brunett towards the Western Ground
 Tuesday these 24 hours strong N.E. trades course N.W. by W.
 June 20th at 6 P.M. set our colours down in distress
 1843 for an English Barque that was to the windward;
 she came down within a half a mile of us, I lowered
 a Boat went on board of her, proved to be the *Gasmia*
 of London 52 days from Bandemans Land full
 of Passengers bound to England; got five fowls &
 bottles of wine and some salts out of her at dark
 returned on board the Brunett quite pleased with
 our success: John D. Bill & J. B. Lane sick and off
 duty I have been half sick for the last week past
 Sat in 18° 22' N
 Long in 35° 45' W

Wednesday
 June 21st all these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.E.
 steering N.W. by carrying all sail Captain and
 the rest of the sick folks on the mending
 hand after breakfast lashed the jib boom
 down I now drew up the gaffs two sails in
 sight from the mast head
 Sat in 20° 35' N
 Long in 36° 45' W

Thursday
 June 22nd these 24 hours light breezes from the N.E. and fair
 weather course N.W. by W. at 2 P.M. Boy Tom was
 taken severely ill vomiting and cramp in the
 stomach after breakfast Capt. Lane bled me &
 Tom; Bill & Lane on duty again latter part
 the watch employed in breaking out after Breeze
 Sat in 21° 41' N
 Long in 37° 23' W

Friday
 June 23rd light breezes & beautiful weather course N.W. by W.
 1843 sent down the fore top gallant yard latter part the
 watch employed in mending the sail

Sat by obs 22° 22' N
 Long in 38° 14' W

Saturday
 June 24th light breezes and fine weather steering N.W. by W. and
 N.W. by W. at 6 P.M. finished the sail and sent the yard
 aloft after breakfast mended the gaff top sail
 latter part the watch employed in mending
 it saw two sails from the mast head
 Sat in 23° 25' N
 Long in 38° 53' W

Sunday
 June 25th comes in with gentle breezes from the N.E.
 1843 steering N.W. and N.W. by W. at 3 P.M. finished and bent
 the gaff top sail middle & latter the weather much the
 same passed great quantity of Gulf weed

Sat by obs 24° 23' N
 Long by Chron 39° 41' W

Monday
 June 26th these 24 hours commenced with moderate breezes
 1843 from the N.E. steering N.W. by W. at 4 P.M. raised Black
 Fish lowered two Boats struck one to the Starboard the
 iron broke, came on board took up the Boats kept off
 the course and out studding sail again middle & latter
 part much the same all the watch employed
 in scrimshanking Tom

Sat in 25° 48' N
 Long in 40° 48' W
