Tuesday Sept 30th

Begins with fine weather
SSE winds stood to the East
saw finbacks the watch employed in
stowing a main sail furnishing the
ship's want and other jobs
Middle part calm

employed in mending a fore sail
Lat 31° 41' S
Long 18° 09' E

Wednesday October 1st
Begins with light air at Sth steered
SSE one sail in sight no whale
Middle part fine weather steered
South through the night
Latter strong breezes stood to the SE
saw one fin back Lat 32° 13'
Long 11° 38' E

Thursday Oct 2d
Begins with strong Sth winds and
cloudy stood to the SE
at 4 PM the ship Fama of
off Brazil Island 9 months
out no 6 PM saw one fin back
Middle part 9 gales steered
SSE the night
Latter fresh gales steered North
nothing employed in repairing
the mizen top sail Lat 30° 27'
Long 10° 41' E

Friday Oct 3d
Begins with strong gales steered North
under 2 reefed top sails saw one fin back
Middle part a gale
Latter the same saw fin backs
Lat 30° 36' Long 9° 14' E

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Brunswick Cruising for whales
Saturday Oct 4th

Begins with a gale from the South
steered North under short sail at 3 PM
saw one Right Whale did not lower
to though the whale lay too head to Sth
Middle part a gale
Latter the same headed N.E saw
Hump Backs and fin Backs

Lat 30° 59' S
Long 8° 14' E

Sunday Oct 5th
Begins with strong gales and though
re a headed head to E.N.E saw
fin Backs and Hump Backs
at dark took in fore and mizen
top sails headed ship head to Sth
Middle part strong gales
Latter more moderate saw Hump Backs
spoke a French ship could not
ascertain her name Lat 31° 13'
Long 7° 43' E

Monday Oct 6th
Begins with moder - gales at
SSE stood to the saw fin backs
at 4 PM spoke surier of
Havre de Grace so the oil
15 months on
Middle part calm
Latter much the same saw
nothing employed in mending fore
top sail Lat 31° 27'
Long 7° 21'
