Latter light air saw nothing

Begins with light air and fine
weather stood to the westward
Middle part light air carried
all sail spoke ship George Porter
of New Bedford no oil
Latter with breezes stood
to the west saw five backs

Lat 31° 00' N
Long 9° 49' E

Friday Oct 17th
Begins with fresh breezes and
fine weather stood to the west
saw many backs plenty
Middle part fine weather
stood to the west
Latter the same saw four
more of the same ships in sight
saw no whales

Lat 32° 05' N
Long 9° 20' E

Saturday Oct 18th
Begins with light S.W. winds and
fine weather steered S.W. four
sail in sight and no whales
Middle part fine
Latter the same saw no whales
Spoke bark brigade no oil

Lat 32° 10' N
Long 8° 37' E

Ship Brunswick 1834

Sunday Oct 19th
Begins with fine weather with
breezes stood to the west spoke
ship Ontario of Sag Harbor no oil
Ship Neptune from London one whale
Ship Inscarova 17 whales saw him
fast to another at sunset took in sail
Middle part strong gales
Latter the same saw one Minnaback

Lat 31° 44' N
Long 9° 29' E

Monday Oct 20th
Begins with strong gales at S.W.
stood to the S.E. saw 3 ships
at 3 P.M. attached ship head to N.W.
at sunset saw three right whales
to late to lower the boats
took in sail headed to N.W.
Middle part moderate
Latter the same saw one whale
chased could not catch him two
ships in sight one Boiling

Long 9° 07' E

Tuesday Oct 21st
Begins with light air and fine
weather stood to the S.W. saw
one whale going quick to windward
Middle part fine
Latter the same saw whales
chased could not strike
whales very wild this is hard
times for the 21st of Oct
