

Remarks on Board

Tedus Oct. 22d

Begins with fine weather stood to the south at 2 PM tackled ship head to the north at 1 PM saw a whale chased could not strike whales wild middle part moderate latter strong breezes and rain saw Hump Backs three sail in sight Lat 31° 38'

Thursday Oct 23d

Begins with strong gales and squalls of rain stood to the S E spoke ship Brandt three whales spoke ship Martha of New Bedford 900 lbs saw one whale chased could not strike took in sail middle part more moderate latter fine weather saw two whales chased could not strike no ends three ships sight all tide Lat 32° 11' Long 18° 48'

Friday Oct.

Begins with rain and clear weather saw several Hump Backs three sail in sight none boiling as yet middle part calm latter light breezes at 4 PM saw no whales three ships in sight none boiling Lat 31° 36' Long 9° 18'

Trip Brunswick 1834

Saturday Oct 25th

Begins with light N W winds stood to the N E saw great numbers of Hump Backs saw a ship. Manoeuvre to the leeward at sunset took in sail middle part fine weather latter thick cloudy weather saw plenty of Hump Backs spoke ship. Mention of Groton one whale four ships Lat 31° 10' S Long 18° 08' E

Sunday Oct 26

Begins with thick cloudy weather steered S E at 2 PM heavy rain took in top gall at sail at 6 PM took in sail saw two whales to late to lower the boats middle part thick and rainy latter part fresh breezes and cloudy saw Hump Backs no sight whales one strange sail in sight Lat 32° 01' Long 11° 53'

Monday Oct 27th

Begins with fresh breezes and cloudy weather stood to the S E saw 5 fin Backs at 1 PM shortened sail steered north short west middle part moderate latter the same saw nothing Lat 32° 10' S

At 7 AM Long 18° 46'

at 10 AM Chron 11° 24'

at 4 PM Chron 11° 22'

which is 38 miles to far east
