Thursday Noon 20th

Begins with calm and pleasant weather no whales two ships in sight one Boiling at dark took in light sails for night Middle part light air Latter calm saw whales could not strike four ships in sight. Lat 33° 32'

Long 6° 55'

Friday Noon 21st

Begins with calm and pleasant weather saw whales could not strike spoke ship Endeavour 6 whales and 400 sperm 15 months out Middle part calm Latter the same saw whales struck killed and took to the ship so ends Lat 33° 47'

Saturday Noon 22d

Begins with light air fine weather all hands employed in cutting several ships in sight and plenty of whales we want two tomorrow we have got one Middle part light air and fine weather Latter the same all hands employed in Boiling saw a few whales 8 ships in sight whales will

Lat 34° 02'

Long 7° 07'

Ship Brunswick 1834

Sunday Noon 23d

Begins with light breezes and fine weather all hands employed in Boiling at 3 PM saw whales chased struck killed and took to the ship commenced cutting took in the head and lips and quit for night to dark to cut Middle part moderate Latter the same finished cutting the whale made sail stood to the west saw no right whales eight ships in sight three Boiling Lat 34° 13'

Long 7° 21'

Monday Noon 24th

Begins with fine weather fresh breezes from the north stood to the west saw plenty of fin backs and ships Middle part strong gales and rain Latter strong gales and cloudy all hands employed in Boiling and stowing down saw no whales spoke ship Liverpool of New Bedford 1300 out two seasons spoke Berth Mary of St. Andrews 7 whales Lat 34° 57'

Tuesday Noon 25th

Begins with fresh gales and cloudy weather all hands Boiling and stowing down Middle part fresh gales finished boiling Latter more moderate stowed down Lat 34° 11' S
