

Remarks On Board
Wednesday Nov 26th
Begins with moderate breezes
and cloudy weather finished
stowing down. saw Amos Backs
spoke ship George of Nantucket
with three whales spoke a
Frenchman with five whales
middle part moderate
Latter the same saw no whales
Lat 33° 06'
Long 5° 23' E

Thursday Nov 27th
Begins with moderate breezes
and fine weather stood to
the East & East
middle part fine weather
carried double reefed top
sails through the night
Latter fine weather at 9 AM
saw whales lowered struck
and killed one at 12 noon
took him along side one ship
in sight no land Lat 32° 51'
Long 5° 42' E

Friday Nov 28th
Begins fine all hands employed
in cutting saw whales chased
could not strike at 4 PM
finished cutting began to boil
middle part fine weather
Latter the same saw one
whale chased could not strike
all hands employed in boiling
one ship in sight
Lat 32° 53'

Long 7° 00' E

Ship Brunswick 1834²⁷
Saturday Nov 29th
Begins with fine weather brisk
breezes stood to the S E saw
one whale chased could not
strike at 4 PM took ship
head to the westward
middle part fine weather
Latter the same stowed down
Lat 33° 04' S
Long 6° 19' E

Sunday Nov 30th
Begins with calm and pleasant
weather finished stowing down
saw a whale chased could not
strike at sunset took in sail
middle part calm
Latter light air and fine weather
saw no whales one ship in sight
caught a sun fish Lat 33° 09'
Long 6° 36' E

Monday December 1st
Begins with light breezes and
pleasant weather stood to
the S E saw a few whales
could not strike saw a ship
middle part moderate
Latter fresh breezes and fine
weather saw no whales spoke
ship Commodore Barry of
New London 500 whale oil
250 sperm saw no whales
Lat 34° 48'

Long 6° 30' E
