

Remarks on Board Ship

Sunday 15th Feb

All these 24 hours light air at the north all ready for sea took on board the two men from Orion Orion fees for the two \$20.

Monday Feb 16th

All these 24 hours strong S winds at 9 Am took our anchor and proceeded to sea at 12 noon the Lion's Pump bore S E distant 8 miles from which I take my departure for the Mozambique Channel.

Tuesday Feb 17th

Begins with strong gales at S E steered to the West under close reefed top sails to get off shore Middle part hard gales took in Mizzen top sail Latter more moderate stood to W S W so ends

Long 17° 00'

Wednesday Feb 18th

Begins with strong gales at S E and bear from sea Middle part strong gales and rough sea bear to the N S W Latter much the same carried close reefed top sails and reefed courses saw nothing

Lat 34° 15' - 1

Long 15° 15' 8

Brunswick at Cape town

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Thursday Feb 19th

Begins with strong gales at S E and rough sea steered by the wind to the N S W under Port sail Middle part moderate made sail as required at 6 Am tacked to S E Latter light winds and cloudy saw nothing the watch employed in various jobs of ship's duty P. No 0th

Friday Feb 20th

Begins with light winds from S W and cloudy steered S E by the wind with all sail set Middle part light air and cloudy Latter light breezes from the West and clear saw a ship standing to the N. N. W.

Saturday Feb 21st

Begins with light westerly winds and fine weather steered S E Middle part heavy gales stood to the West under close reefed main top sail and reefed fore sail Latter more moderate steered to S E under close reefed top sails and reefed fore sail and spencers saw a ship steering N. W. so ends
