doubtful

Middle part fresh breezes and
cloudy with squalls of wind and rain

Thursday March 5th

Begins with light breezes and variable
steered by the wind to E. by E saw
nothing of the whale kind

Middle part moderate trade ship
head to the S by E

Latter fine weather brisk breezes
steered by the wind to the S by E

saw no whales
