Sunday March 8th

Begins with light S.W. winds and fine weather course East speed 4 knots saw Grampuses Middle part brisk breezes and cloudy attended with squalls of rain Latter the same speed 7 1/2 knots

Lat 38° 12' N

Long 38° 21' E

Monday March 9th

Begins with fresh breezes at West and squalls of rain steered S.W. with all moving sail set speed 7 1/2 knots saw no whales

Middle part squally with rain Latter fine weather saw nothing

Lat 36° 37' N

Long 32° 32' W

Long 32° 41' W

Tuesday March 10th

Begins with light breezes at S.W. and fine weather steered S.W. at 4 PM the wind hauled to the S.E. braced the yards so as a sail off the Lee Sea

Middle part fine

Latter the same saw no whales saw a sail steering East the watch employed in mending sails and other jobs

Wednesday March 11th

Begins with light breezes at S.E. and fine weather course East speed 4 knots one sail in sight Middle part light winds and fine weather steered S.W. by the wind one ship in sight saw nothing of the whale kind

Lat 34° 15' N

Long 34° 56' E

Thursday March 12th

Begins with fresh S.W. winds and fine weather stood to the S.W. by the wind one ship in sight Middle part strong breezes and squally with rain Latter fresh breezes and clear

saw nothing of the whale kind

Lat 32° 23' N

Long 34° 58' E

Friday March 13th

Begins with fresh East winds and ~~clear~~ clear steered by the wind to the S.W. under single reef of top sails

Middle part moderate

Latter the same wind variable

Lat 30° 41' N

Long 35° 07' E

Saturday March 14th

Begins with brisk S.E. wind and fine weather steered East by the wind with all sail set Middle and Latter part strong breezes and squally

Lat 29° 10' N

Long 36° 15' E
