

Remarks On Board Ship Brunswick

Sunday March 22^d

Begins with fine weather brisk S.W. winds stood in for the Land at sunset double reefed the top sails hauled off shore head to N.W. fresh breezes and cloudy but at 8 P.M. close reefed the fore and mizen top sails the Land 10 miles distant by estimation Middle part strong gales three reefed the top sails headed West Latter part fresh gales stood in for the Land Lat 0° 24' 08" Long 43° 21'

Monday March 23^d

Begins with strong S.W. gales and rough sea at 10 P.M. heeled ship head to N.W. at 3 P.M. saw a strange sail Middle part a heavy gale stood to the S.W. through the night Latter much the same stood to the Eastward one ship in sight Lat 0° 24' 13" Long 43° 12'

Tuesday March 24th

Begins with heavy gales at S.W. stood in the Eastward three strain & sail in sight Middle part heavy gales headed to the West took in the fore sail Lat - more moderate moderate sail stood in for the Land. Three ships in sight

Lat 0° 23' 00"
Long 43° 00' 40"
Long 0° 42' 00"

In the Mozambique Channel

Wednesday March 25th

Begins with strong breezes at S.W. stood in for the Land at 10 P.M. heeled ship head off shore close reefed the top sails fresh breezes and clear Middle part light breezes Latter fine weather spoke the ship Onlaris of Sag Harbor 800 tuns at 12 noon calm Lat 23° 39' S Long 43° 43' E

Thursday March 26th

Begins with calm and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. the wind came in from the West stood in for the Bay at 6 P.M. came to anchor in St. Augustine Bay in the Island of Madagascar in 8 fathoms water four other ships in the Bay so ends sea account.

All there 24 hours fine weather all hands getting wood and water

Saturday March 28th

All there 24 hours fine weather all hands working and watering

Sunday March 29th

All there 24 hours fine weather part of the crew on liberty
