All these 24 hours fine
weather all hands employed in blacking
and painting ship

Saturday April 4th
All these 24 hours fine
finished painting got ready for

Sunday April 5th
All these 24 hours fine
took our anchor and went to
the ship Courier and George & Mary
in company

Monday April 6th
Begins with fine weather
and brisk breezes at 8 AM
Middle part calm
Latter light breezes stood
to the south three ships in sight
saw nothing of the whale kind

St. Augustine Bay
Tuesday April 7th
Begins with fine weather light winds
stood to the south
Middle part calm
Latter the same saw no whales
three ships in sight Lat 24° 01'
Long 43° 20'

Wednesday April 8th
Begins with fine weather brisk
breezes stood to the south
at 2 PM lashed ship head to NW
Middle part fresh breezes and rough
Latter the same stood to the NW
saw no whales saw two ships
steering to the east

Lat 23° 55'
Long 41° 39'

Thursday April 9th
Begins with fresh breezes and
rough sea stood to the NW
ship George and Martha A Bedford
at sunset took in sail headed to the
west the ship George & Martha in company
Middle part fresh gales
Latter the same saw no whales

Lat 23° 24'
Long 40° 40'

Friday April 10th
Begins with fresh gales at 8 AM
steered north at 2 PM strong
gales took in sail
Middle part strong gales
Latter more moderate
steered N. E. & saw no whales
