

Remarks On Board Ship.
Thursday May 28th
Begins with fine weather
steered S 8 all hands employed
in Boiling saw fin Back
Middle part light winds
Latter the same saw no whale
finished boiling Lat 27° 04'
Long 44° 51'

Friday May 29th
Begins with light breezes
and variable stood to the East
with all sail set.
Middle part brisk breezes
Latter the same headed to
the N. E. saw the Land at
9 AM bearing N. 8 by N.
Cape St. Marys Lat 06 26° 14'
Long 44° 35'

Saturday May 30th
Begins with light E. N. E.
winds and fine weather stood
to the south saw no whales
Middle part strong gales
Latter the same No Obs

Sunday May 31st
All three ~~ships~~ ~~ships~~ ~~ships~~ gales
and squalls the
Eastward with all sail
prudent saw fin Backs
saw something that had
the appearance of Land
No Obs
Lat 26° 00'
by Sec

Brunswick 1835
Monday June the 1st
Begins with fresh gales at S 8
and heavy sea steered by
the wind to S 8 we are
bound to Antongil Bay
but the winds and weather
seem to be against us for the
last 15 days
Middle part strong breezes
and squally
Latter fresh breezes and clear
saw a Brig steering to the N. E.
Lat 06 26° 01'
Long 46° 47' 50'

Tuesday June 2d
Begins with fresh S 8 winds
and passing clouds lower S 8
speed 6 knots saw one Hump Back
Middle part fresh breezes
and squally
Latter the same saw no whales
Lat 06 25° 33'
Long 49° 22'

Wednesday June 3d
Begins with strong breezes
at S 8 by and a squally steered
East saw no whales
Middle part fine weather fresh
breezes steered N. E.
Latter the same saw fin Backs
Lat 06 23° 29'
Long 06 49° 55-8
Long by Chron 49° 05'

The Longitude by Chronometer is
50 miles to far west by observation
on June the first - also by
observation to day June 3d.
