

Remarks on Board Ship Brunner

Thursday June 4th

Begins with fresh SSW wind and
passing clouds steered N.E.
speed 7 1/2 knots saw one
Hump Back whale the ship
London Packet N. Bedford
in company with us

Middle part strong breezes
and squally

Latter part fresh breezes and
cloudy steered N.E.

Lat 21° 28'

Long 50° 50'

Friday May 5th

All these 24 hours fresh breeze
and squally steered N.E. saw
no whales stowed down
38 barrels sperm oil

Lat 19° 37'

Long 51° 46'

Saturday May 6th

Begins with fresh SE trade
winds and cloudy steered.
N.E. saw a Brig steering
to the S.W.

Middle and latter part
strong breezes at SE saw no whales

Lat 18° 08'

Long 51° 53'

Sunday June 7th

Begins with strong SE trades and
flying clouds steered N.E.
Middle and latter part fine
weather - saw fin backs

Lat 16° 47'

Long 51° 30'

Bond to Antongil Bay 1835 Thelth Mont

Monday June 8th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant
weather stood to the North saw fin
backs

Lat 15° 54'

Long 51° 00'

Tuesday June 9th

Begins with fine weather with
SE trades steered west at 4 PM

saw the land bearing N.W.
distant 40 miles the North head
of Antongil Bay took in sail

Middle part fresh breezes
and flying clouds

Latter part the same stood in for
the land so ends Lat 15° 55'

Wednesday June 10th

Begins with brisk breezes at
SE at 12 noon tacked ship
head off shore

Middle part strong breezes
and squally

Latter strong breezes and
rough sea split the fore
sail unbutton it and bent
a new one saw the land

Lat 15° 49'

Thursday June 11th

Begins with strong gales
at SE stood to the ESE
under close reefed topsails and
courses the London Packet in
company with us

Middle part a gale of wind
Latter the same stood to the
ESE under close reefed sails

Lat 15° 23' Long 52° 07'
