and rain finished boiling

Friday July 31st  
All this day fresh gales  
and rain employd in stowing down  
the oil

Saturday August 1st  
Begins with fresh breeze and  
rain struck and killed one  
whale sunk him

Sunday August 2nd  
All this day fine  
the boats of whaling got  
nothing
