Wednesday Oct 28th

Begins with strong gales at
West and rough sea steered
E. S. E. saw nothing at sunset
took in sail headed S. N. W.
Three ships in sight one
boiling the body of Newbury

Middle part moderate
Latter the same steered to
E. S. E. saw nothing three
ships in sight

Lat 37. 56 S
Long 42. 14 E

Thursday Oct 29th

Begins with light breezes at
S. E. and heavy swell headed
to the S. E. saw nothing
Middle part light breeze

Latter the same thick rain
to 8

Friday Oct 30th

Begins with calm and thick
rain at 4 PM light
South winds and cloudy
Middle part a gale

Latter the same stood to the
west saw nothing Lat 38. 12 S
Long 40. 38 E
Long 40. 14 E

Ship Brunswick 1835

Saturday Oct 31st

Begins with fresh gales at South
and cloudy stood to the west
saw fin backs water very green
spoke ship Phoenix sag North 15-00
Middle part fine
Latter the same saw nothing

Lat 38. 26 S
Long 39. 49 E

Sunday November 1st

Begins with fine weather light
winds saw two whales some
could not strike whales all going
quick not appearing to have any
regularity to the course

spoke ship Washington ship
Phoenix in sight chasing whales
Middle part calm

Latter the same saw whales
Lowered stunk and killed one
at 8 AM took him to the ship
at 10 lowered stunk and killed
and the muck him with one line
and a half and four iron
finished cutting saw and the
shard could not farther
commenced boiling it ends
