Latter fresh breezes finished Boiling all hands employed in stowing down oil saw two merchantmen steering ESE

Thursday Noon 5th

Begins with fresh North winds and fine weather steered Sth saw fin backs saw a strange sail

Middle part fine near West

Latter the same saw a whale lowered struck killed at 11 AM

took him along side commenced cutting so ends

Friday Noon 6th

Begins with fine weather all hands employed in cutting at 3 PM finished commenced Boiling

saw ship Washington

Middle part a gale

Latter more moderate made sail took to the West saw no whale all hands employed in Boiling and stowing down

Lat 38.28 S

Saturday Noon 7th

All there 24 hours fresh breezes and variable finished Boiling saw no whales

Lat 37.57 S
Long 39.04

Sunday Noon 8th

Begins with fresh N. N. E winds and cloudy steered to ESE saw one fin back

Middle part fresh gales

Latter much the same all hands employed in stowing down and cleaning bone
