

Remarks on Board Ship

Wednesday November 25th

Begins with fresh breeze at N.E. steered East under single reefed top sails at 6 P.M. saw a wright whale lowered did not strike it being rough so that we could not pull to windward fast enough for the whale. Middle part strong gales from the North with thunder lightning and heavy rain took in the fore sail. Latter part heavy gales and rain.

Begins with strong gales at N.E. and heavy sea headed to N.W. at 8 P.M. more moderate set the fore sail at 6 P.M. heeled ship head to N.E. set the spencers.

Begins with fresh North winds and cloudy stood to the N.W. saw fin Backs and birds water green.

Middle part strong breezes. Latter heavy gales and squalls steered N.E. saw no whales.

Saturday November 28th

Begins with heavy gales at West and squalls steered N.E. at 4 P.M. took in fore top sail and reefed the fore sail at sunset. Throve too head to N.E. Middle part heavy gales and hard squalls.

Latter more moderate made sail stood to the North saw nothing.

Sunday Nov 29th

Begins with fresh breezes at West south West stood to South and West.

Middle part fresh gales. Latter the same stood to the North saw one fin Back. water very green.

Monday November 30th

Begins with strong gales at West stood to the North under close reefed top sails and courses.

Middle part light air from the West made all sail stood to the North at 7 Am tacked to N.W.

Latter fresh breezes and squally I reefed the top sails saw a ship standing to the East.
