Tuesday Decm 8th
 Begins with fine weather light
 winds from the N.E. steered
 West saw fin Backs finished
 the fore sail bent it again

Middle part fine
 Latter the same employed
 in altering spanker saw
 no whales

 Begins with brisk breezes from
 the North and cloudy
 at 3 PM the wind shifted to
 the South in a squall took
 in sail as required steered N.W.
 Middle part strong gales at S.E.
 steered N.W.

Latter part more moderate
 made sail steered N.W. saw
 no whales

Lat 36.36 S
 Long 38.47 E

Thursday Decm 10th
 Begins with moderate breezes
 from S.W. made all sail steered
 N.W. at 6 PM saw a shoal
 of sperm whales lowered
 but could not strike they were
 going very fast to the S.W.

Middle part light airs and
 fine weather

Latter light East winds
 employed in repairing main
 sail and fore top mast staysail
 saw no whales Lat 36.15 S

Long 38.31 East

Friday Decm 11th
 Begins with light East winds and fine
 weather lounge West with all sail
 Middle part fine weather
 Latter the same at fore top
 mast steering sail

Lat 36.54 S
 Long 31.09 E
