

Remarks On Board Ship

Thursday Decm 17th

Begins with brisk West winds and cloudy stood to the North main single reefed top sails and main top gallant sail at 4 PM hauled squalls double reefed at 6 PM fresh gales close reefed fore and main sail

Middle part moderate at day light saw whales chased and killed at 10 AM saw whales could not fasten fine weather plenty of whales

Long 24.12

Friday Decm 18th

Begins with light breezes at 1 PM and fine weather at 10 PM saw whales lowered struck and drawn at 5 PM saw others lowered struck and drawn at 7 PM run 15 minutes high saw whales lowered struck and killed one at 8 PM took him along side made him fast for night too late to cut

Middle part fine
Latter the same cut in the whale made sail stood to 1 PM by 06 found that we have been past one degree and 25 miles to the East in 14 hours

Saturday Decm 19th

Begins with fine weather light SE winds stered to N saw no whales the watch employed in boiling

Middle part moderate
Latter the same all hands employed in boiling

Lat 06 24.15 E

Sunday Decm 20th

Begins with fine weather light SE winds stood to the west saw one whale going quick did not lower at sunset fresh breezes with heavy rain finished boiling

Middle part a gale
Latter more moderate made sail stood to N saw two whales did not lower too far to the windward saw a ship steering to the East all hands employed in stowing down oil

Lat 06 37.38 S

Long ~~24.12~~ 24.54 E

Monday Decm 21st

Begins with fine weather light Easterly winds stood to the N saw one whale going quick lowered but could not catch him

Middle part calm
Latter light East winds and fine weather stood to the South saw no whales saw a boat

Long 25.19 E
