 saw no whales caught a turtle
 No Obs

Wednesday Jan 6th
 Begins with fresh gales at S. by E.
 and cloudy steered N. by E. by
 the wind saw no whales
 water green plenty of birds
 Middle part calm
 Latter the same saw fin backs
 the watch employed in mending
 sails and shifting them
 Lat Obs 39.12
 Long 13.36

Thursday Jan 7th
 Begins with light airs at S. by E. stood
 to the North and west saw no fish
 Middle part brisk breezes
 Latter the same steered N. by E.
 the watch employed in mending
 main top sail saw one whale
 going quick to South did not lower
 Lat Obs 39.04 S
 Long 11.49 E

Friday Jan 8th
 Begins with brisk South winds
 and fine weather steered
 N. by E. saw no whales
 saw Black fish plenty of Birds
 water very green
 Middle part light airs
 Latter part calm saw fin Backs
 the watch employed in setting
 up Rigging
 Lat Obs 39.38 S
 Long 11.23 E

Saturday Jan 9th
 Begins with calm and pleasant
 weather at 2 PM light airs from
 N. by E. wore ship head to S. by E.
 saw fin Backs and Black fish

Middle part brisk breezes
 stood to the South
 Latter the same with cloudy
 weather attended with fog
 saw one whale lowered did
 not fasten

Lat Obs 41.59 S
 Long -- 11.14 E
