

Remarks on Board Ship Brunswick
Sunday Jan 10th

Begins with light westerly winds
and cloudy with fog steered to
the south by the wind saw one
whale could not fasten

Middle part calm with fog
Latter light winds and fine
weather steered north saw no whale
went fore and mizen top gallant
sails and set them

Lat 41. 17 S
Long 10. 49 E

Monday January 11th
Begins with light East winds
and fine weather steered north
we have one man sick off duty
apparently the scurvy

Middle part fresh breezes
with rain

Latter fresh breezes with
thick fog and rain wind
N.W. headed west

No 8th

Lat by Sec 41. 50

Tuesday Jan 12th
Begins with fresh breezes
at N.W. and thick fog
stood to the west by the wind
saw porpoises water blue

Middle part thick fog
Latter the same with light
winds No 8th

Jan South Atlantic Ocean 1836

Wednesday Jan 13th
Begins with light N.W. winds and
thick fog stood to the west
under short sail saw no whales
water blue

Middle part light winds thick fog
Latter light winds at N.W. and
hazy weather stood to N.W. saw
one whale lowered could not
strike water blue

Lat 42. 50 S

Long 8. 19 E

Thursday Jan 14th
Begins with light N.W. winds and
hazy weather stood to the N.W.
under all sail we have now got
three men down with the scurvy

Middle part fresh breezes from
N.W. stood to the west

Latter part light winds and
variable headed to North and
East under all sail saw nothing

Lat 43. 12 S

Long 7. 10 E

Friday Jan 15th
Begins with light airs and cloudy
stood to the North and East

Middle part light airs

Latter the same stood to the
North by West wind West

Lat 42. 31 S

Long 6. 50 E
