1 P.M. calm lost steering way,

Middle part light airs
tacked ship head to the N.W.

Latter part light breezes from
north and cloudy stood to the
N.W. saw porpoises struck
and drawn

Sunday

Sunday Jan 17th
Begins with light north winds
and cloudy stood to N.W.
saw porpoises

Middle part brisk breezes
and thick fog

Latter the same stood to
N.W. by the wind N.W.

Monday Jan 18th
Begins with brisk N.W. winds
and thick fog attended with rain
stood to the N.W. at 2 P.M.
wore ship head to N.E. thick
and hazy

Middle part light breezes from
the south steered N.W.

Latter the same with all sail set
saw nothing employed in ship duty

Tuesday Jan 19th

Begins with light southerly winds
and fine weather steered N.W.
with all drawing sail set saw a brass
at 4 P.M. saw one whale lowered could
not strike at 7 P.M. saw several could
not get fast at sunset whales
in sight double reefed the top sails
and hauled up the main sail headed
N.W. three men down with the hawser
and one with the Rheumatism

Middle part thick fog wind variable
Latter thick fog wind N.W.
headed to the North and West

Tuesday 10 P.M.

Wednesday Jan 20th

Begins with fresh breezes at N.W.
and thick fog stood to the North
and West under all sail

at 6 P.M. tacked ship head to N.W.

Middle part strong breezes
double reefed the top sails

Latter part fresh breezes from
the S.W. steered N.W. made all sail
thick cloudy weather saw four backs

10 P.M. Long 4.19 E

Thursday Jan 21st

Begins with fresh breezes at S.W. and
thick cloudy weather Course N.W.
set fore top mast steering sail

Middle part strong breezes to N.W.
top gallant sails and fore top mast St. sail

Latter fresh breezes and cloudy
saw a ship steering E.S.E. saw no
whales the watch employed in ship duty
