Middle part brisk breezes and cloudy
Latter the same employed in washing ship gave nothing

Friday Jan 29th

Begins with fresh S.E. winds and cloudy steered north nothing in sight
Middle part fresh breezes
Latter the same gave nothing
set the lower steering sail and main top mast steering sail

Lat 0° 20' 22" S

Long 3° 13' W

Saturday Jan 30th

Begins with fresh S.E. trades and fine weather steered S.W. & gave nothing we have one man very near dead with the scurvy
Middle part squally
Latter thick cloudy weather with breezes

Lat 0°

Long 3° 30' W

St. Helena Jan 1836

Sunday Jan 31st

Begins with fresh S.E. trades and cloudy attended with squalls steered S.W. & with all sail set at 8 PM took in the steering sails strong squalls of wind with some rain
Middle part fine

Latter the same saw a ship steering N.W. 10-0°

Long 4° 45' W

Monday Feb 1st

Begins with a brisk trade and fine weather steered S.W. at 8 PM took in the steering sails
Middle part fine

Latter the same at daylight saw the Isle of St. Helena bearing N.W. by N distant 30 miles made all sail stood in for it

Lat 0° 15' 55"

Long 5° 30' W

Tuesday Feb 2nd

Begins with fresh trades and fine weather at 2 PM passed the fort at 3 PM came to anchor in James town harbor in 22 fathoms water 8 ships in the roads thus ends the 2d

Wednesday Feb 3rd

All these 3d. P.M. fine weather lying at anchor one watch and shore the rest painting ship
