speed 7 knots per hour

Middle part strong breezes
Latter the same from E. & S.
Saw nothing of the whale kind

Sunday March 6th
Begins with fresh E. & S. winds
and fine weather course S by N
speed 7 knots the hour
Middle part brisk breezes
Latter the same one ship in
sight steering N. W.

Lat Obs 9. 02. N
Long 41. 48 W

Monday March 7th
Begins with brisk E. & S. trades
and fine weather course S by N
speed 7 knots one strange sail
in company apparently a whale
Middle part strong breezes
and clear

Latter much the same
at 12 Meridian found the
Mizen top sail yard to
be very badly sprung
took in Mizzen top gallant
sail and furl it one sail
in sight

Long 43. 43 W

Providence To I. 1836

Tuesday March 8th
Begins with fresh E. & S. winds
and fine weather course S by N
speed 7 knots sent down
the Mizzen top sail yard
fished it sent it up bent
and set the sail fresh breezes
and squalls over ship head
Middle part strong breezes
squally

Latter the same saw
nothing
Lat Obs 12. 44. N
Long 45. 33 W

Wednesday March 9th
Begins with brisk E. & S. winds
and passing clouds sent up
the main royal mast
Middle part strong breezes and
squally
Latter the same

Lat Obs 14. 37. N
Long 47. 15 W

Thursday March 10th
Begins with strong E. & S. winds
and squalls steered S by N
saw a Brig steering N. W.

Middle part strong breezes

Latter the same steered S. W.

Lat Obs 16. 27

Chronometer 2 degrees Long 49. 46 Chron
to far East at 8 am Long Obs 50. 48
