at E. & S. E. and squally steered

Begins with fresh gales at E. & S. E.
and squally lower N. W.
saw a Brig. steering to the south.

Tuesday March 15th

Begins with strong E. & S. E. winds
and fine weather lower N. W.
with all sail set at 8 PM
strong squalls single reefed
the watch employed in mending
and Middle reaming main
spencer and other jobs

Middle part fresh breezes
saw a Brig steering N. W.

Latter light breezes and squally
saw nothing the watch employed
in mending fore top mast stay
sail it ends

Wednesday March 16th

Begins with light breezes at N. E.
and squally steered N. W.
Middle part moderate
Latter the same at 10 A M Boarded
a Brig showing Portuguese colors no name
on the stern painted black with
