Thursday March 24th

Begins with strong gales at N.W. and rough sea stood to N.N.E. by the wind at 6 P.M. wore ship & head to S.W. one ship in sight headed to S.W. under short sail

Middle part Calm
Latter the same Lat 86 33.57
Long Chron 69.11 W
Long 86 70.05 W

Friday March 25th

Begins with calm and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. light airs at S.E. steered N.N.W. set fore top mast steering sail

Middle part light S.E. winds and cloudy steered N.N.W.

Latter light breezes and rainy No 86

Saturday March 26th

Begins with light breezes at E.S.E. and thick rainy weather steered N.W. by S. at 1 P.M. took the wind at N.E. in a squall took in top gallant sails double reefed the top at 2 P.M. hard gales took in sail bore too head to N.W. strong gales with hard squalls of wind and rain

Middle part heavy gales with hard squalls

Latter the same No 86

Providence 1836.

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Sunday March 27th

Begins with heavy gales at N.E. and hard squalls. Lay too head to N.W. we are now in the stream of Florida there is a heavy sea on which causes the ship to labor hard and the oil to leak badly

Middle part more moderate made sail as required

Latter light N.N.E. winds and fine weather Lat 86 35.40.1

Long 86 73.31 W

Long Chron 74.05 W

Monday March 28th

Begins with light N.N.E. winds and fine weather at 2 P.M. calm at 7 P.M. light airs at S.E. squared the yards steered N.N.W.

Middle part brisk breezes from the south steered N.N.W.

Latter fresh breezes at West sprung fore top mast steering sail Boobin saw Brig standing to the south

Lat 86 36.21

Long 74.12

Tuesday March 29th

Begins with fresh West winds and warm weather steering N.N.W. with all sail set

Middle part light breezes at North stood to E.N.E.

Latter light winds stood to N.W.

Lat 86 37.30
