Sunday October 2nd
 Begins with light North winds and
 cloudy stood to E.N.E. saw nothing
 Middle part light breezes
 Latter the same with thick fog
 saw two ships No Ob.

Monday October 3rd
 Begins with light N.W. winds and
 thick fog at 4 P.M. the fog lighted
 at 6 P.M. saw several whales
 Middle part strong gales
 Latter the same saw one whale
 saw 4 ships No Ob.

Tuesday October 4th
 Begins with strong gales at West
 headed to the N.W. under
 short sail four ships in sight
 Middle part moderate
 Latter fine saw no whales spoke ship
 Cavilier of Salem 2 whales spoke ship
 Camillus 3 whales Lat 35.23 Long 26.15 at 8 A.M.
