All of these 24 hours strong gales
and rough sea lay too
four ships in sight Lat 36.36

Begins with a gale at West
lay to head North
Middle part fine
Latter the same Lat 35.55

Ship Ground 1896 1897

Saturday Dec 10th
Begins with fine weather
light winds at 4 PM saw
whales lowered truck killed and
took to the ship began to cut
took head throat and lips
and shed down

Middle part fine
Latter the same cut in the
whale saw others chase could
not fasten Lat 35.09

Long 22.14

Sunday Dec 11th
Begins with fine weather light
winds at 4 PM lowered truck and
drawed on cut the line which is
worse

Middle part fine
Latter the same saw whales
Intensity got one Lat 35.08

Long 22.00

Monday Dec 12th
Begins with fine weather light
winds at 4 PM got the whale
along side cut him in

Middle part fine
Latter strong breezes stowed down
No 06

Tuesday Dec 13th
Begins with strong breezes and heavy
rain all hands employed in stowing
Middle part a gale with rain
Latter the same saw one ship
No 06
