 began to boil

 Latter the same got one
 whale No 9
 Lat 35.06

Wednesday Decr 28th
 All these 24 hours strong breezes
 and rain with fog saw 2 whales
 Lat 35.50

Thursday Decr 29th
 Begins with strong gales at the North
 headed to the West at 20 PM
 wore ship beat to sea two ships
 in sight both boiling
 Middle part a gale
 with some rain still boiling
 Latter thick with fog
 Lat 35.30

Friday Decr 30th
 All of these 24 hours strong breezes
 finished boiling stowed down
 saw whales did not lower
 Lat 35.11
