Remarks On Board Friday August 11th
 The first part of these twenty four hours light breeze from
 N.E. standing to the S. we sail in sight at 8
 P.M. looked to the S.E. saw gannets the middle part fresh
 breeze from the S. at sunset shortened single reefed & stood
 to the N. at daylight looked to the E. the last part of
 these twenty four hours moderate breeze from the S.E.
 steering to the E. saw gannets & saw a piece in
 sight employed. A booby & a turtle in sight so ends

Remarks On Board Saturday August 12th
 The first part of these twenty four hours moderate breeze from
 the S.E. steering to the E. at 4 P.M. made all sail & stood
 by the wind to the N. saw gannets the middle part light
 breeze from N. to N.E. at sunset took in sail & heading to
 the N. at daylight made sail the last part light breeze
 from the N.E. standing to the N.W. sail in sight saw
 gannets & saw a piece in sight employed breaking out
 & filling casks with salt water & stowing them away
 & shifting coal from one side to the other & putting
 some in a scupper over the stern & some in the collar
 so ends

 The first part of these twenty four hours light breeze

Remarks On Board Monday August 14th
 From the N.E. calm A standing to the E. at 3 P.M. looked
 to the N.W. sail in sight saw gannets at 4 calm at 5
 took in sail the middle part light breeze from the E.
 S.W. made sail the last part light breeze from the E.
 A standing on both tacks saw gannets & saw a piece in
 sight in sight so ends

Remarks On Board Tuesday August 15th
 The first part of these twenty four hours light breeze from
 the S.E. standing on both tacks at 8 P.M. saw
 small turtle & lowered a boat for him but did not
 get it the middle part light breeze from the S.E. at
 sunset shortened sail & headed to the N. at daylight
 made sail & wore ship to the E. the last part moderate
 breeze from the S.E. steering to the S.E. saw sail in
 sight saw great quantities of gannets & saw a piece
 in sight employed in sea duty so ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday August 16th
 The first part of these twenty four hours moderate breeze
 from the S.E. steering to the S.E. at 4 P.M. wore ship
 & stood by the wind to the N. saw great quantities
 of gannets the middle part light breeze from the S.W. at sunset
 took in sail & headed to the N. at daylight made sail
 wore ship & stood to the S.E. the last part moderate breeze
 from the S.W. steering to the S.E. saw gannets & saw a number
 of schools they came round the vessel shot two of them
 one with a ball the other with a bomb lance he went
 down & we saw no more of him probably it killed
 him dead & he sunk caught a number of small dolphins
 at noon payal bore by compass & piece & by S. employed at
 small fish & cleaning fish so ends
