Remarks On Board. Wednesday August 16th

The first part of these twenty four hours Moderate breezes from the S.W. A steering to the S.E. at 6 P.M. we shifted & stood to the N.W. some squalls & porpoises caught. A large dolphin saw a logger head turtle at 8 P.M.

A fog the middle part light breezes from the S.W. A standing at N.W. at daylight. instant ship & stand to the S.E. some at noon fogged here & 10 miles dist. employed at fall so end.

Remarks On Board. Thursday August 17th

The first part of these twenty four hours Moderate breezes from the S.W. A steering to the E. & by 11 A.M. we were down the S. End of Fagel at 4 P.M. in the passage between Fagel & Fico at 5 P.M. the captain with boat crew started for the shore at 8 he came back after the sch. papers & started again at 6 the boat came aboard again it had been part of the way where the middle part light breezes from the S. to S.W. A beating out of the passage the last part Moderate breezes from the S. at 6 A.M. kept off & run in for the passage at 8 the captain with 4 boat crew of picked men situated in the harbour which was 7 miles of run in for the port at 11 the boat came aboard with orders from the captain to come in. Meane which I had been anxious in for the harbour the last 2 hours the boat went straight ashore again at noon subject to with the field sheet to Windward. A quarter of 4 mile from the S. head of the harbour so ends.

Remarks On Board. Friday August 18th

The first part of these twenty four hours Moderate breezes from the S. A lying off & on at Fagel at 8 P.M. the boat came off with potatoes as soon as it was unloaded it went ashore again at 4 the boat came off with

Nehemiah West Master.

Onions & pumpkins unloaded & went ashore again at 6 P.M. the boat came on board with the captain in it the middle part fresh breezes from the S. A beating out the passage at dusk the S. End of Fico bore S.W. the S.W. end of Fagel S.W. by S the last part fresh breezes from the S. at 6 A.M. kept off & run in for the harbour at 8 about the landing the with his boat crew of picked men started there at 10 A.M. the boat came aboard at 11 to hoist the boat up & send it ashore at noon. Noble captain at noon sent the boat in shore so ends.

Remarks On Board. Saturday August 19th

The first part of these these twenty four hours fresh breezes from the S. A lying off & on at Fagel at 8 P.M. the boat came off after 6 bags & went ashore with them the at 6 the boat came off with the Mighty captain Nehemiah West in it & two bls crew one man from the shore. I send stood from the boat to him he was second Mate but he has not been introduced to me now A word said to me about him as soon as the boat was hoisted up kept off & run out of the passage to the N.E. don't know how many potatoes & onions how came aboard. I have not been informed the middle part strong breezes from the S. & by 11 P.M. with heavy rain at 1 P.M. called all hands & doubled & single reefed at Midnight the jib sheet parted & split the sail split the main sail at daylight called Unbent the jib & commenced hoisting & bending it & the main sail forward part of the jib to B. missing got out the spare jib & bent it. repaired the main sail & set it reefed set the jib the last part Moderate breezes from the S. with heavy rain. A steering N.W. A big wave by board. A boat crew sent a bag of potatoes & one of onion aboard.
