all sail fine pleasant weather middle & latter part
moderate sun & squalls & breeze Lat 14.49

Light winds from E. S. E. steering W. by N. to West W
fine pleasant weather middle & latter parts the
same steering W. by N. employed in drawing
yarns & other cables saw nothing Lat 14.49
