This day commenced with light winds from E by S laying under the lee of Florace with the main top sail to the mast the middle and latter part laying off and on getting recruits so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with rain squalls laying off and on Florace got off sixty bushels of potatoes the wind from the S.W. the middle and latter part strong winds and rain so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with strong winds from the S.W. laying off and on Florace at 4.30 the Captain came off got 2 men & a cat in sight the middle and latter part calm so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with rain the middle and latter part calm 2 ships in sight so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine weather steering S. Florace in sight a stern distant 30 bearing S.W. 3 sail in sight standing on different tacks the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same so ends these 24 hours
