Wednesday 29

..... This day commenced with a heavy gale
blowing from the N.W. at 2 PM hove the ship
to the wind under close reefed
mainsail top sail heading South the
mainsail long in sight an over starboard
beam ~~and~~ and one ship
the middle and latter part the wind
and weather much the same so ends
these 24 hours

Thursday 30

..... This day commenced with light winds
blowing and once and a while heavy squalls
at 4 PM tacked ship to the N.W.
the wind all over gods creation
one ship in sight at 6 PM tacked
ship to the South the wind and
weather the same so ends these 24 hours

blowing winds from the N.W.
at 1 PM tacked ship to the
S.W. the middle and latter part
the wind and weather much
the same so ends these 24 hours

December 1854
Saturday 3 off Cape Horn

..... This day commenced with a moderate
gale from the N.W. saw 2 ships
steering off S.E. at 4 PM the wind more
moderate set the mainsail and bill
the middle part light winds from the
N.W. at 6 PM the wind hauled to the
S.W. steering S.W. the wind aft an e ship
in sight steering the same so ends
these 24 hours

Sunday 4

..... This day commenced with a
moderate breeze from the S.E.
steering N.W. saw a large clipper
ship steering S.W. the wind
the middle and latter part the wind
and weather much the same so ends
these 24 hours

Lat 54.10 S

Monday 5

..... This day commenced with strong
winds from the N.W. steering N.W.
2 ships in sight steering the
same the middle and latter part
the wind and weather much the
same so ends these 24 hours
