Monday 11

This day came with a heavy gale from the NW bearing to the Sutherd and Westord with a very heavy sea a running the middle and latter part the wind more moderate made sail to double reefed topsails so ends these 24 hours

This day came with light winds from the West at 4 Bell the wind hauled to the NW steering NW 2 ships in sight at 4 close reefed the topsails the weather thick the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with strong winds from the NW steering by the wind NW at 4 took in the foresail the middle part the wind and weather the same the at 4 Bell the wind hauled to the NW steering NW so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with strong winds from the NW steering NW under close reefed topsails the middle part the wind hauled to the NW tacked ship to the NW the weather thick and rainy saw 2 ships steering E by N so ends these 24 hours

This day came with a moderate gale from the NW steering by the wind NW under close reefed topsails the middle part the wind and weather the same at 4 Bell the wind hauled to the NW tacked ship to the NW at 5 kept a puff NW so ends these 24 hours

This day commenced with a moderate gale from the NW the weather squally under close reefed topsails at 4 Bell took in the foresail and luffed to the wind NW the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same so ends these 24 hours
