Remarks on Board
Sunday 14

This day commenced with
No. 139 light winds from the NW by tacked
ship to the NW the weather
thick and squally and ship in
night steering the same the middle
and latter part the wind and weather
much the same so ends these 24 hours

Monday 15

Lat 54 29 N
Long 78 54 W

This day commenced with a
No. 140 moderate breeze from the NW by
tacked ship to the NW the weather
squally the middle and latter part
the wind light and all over-cast
so ends these 24 hours

Lat 54 04 N
Long 78 54 W

Tuesday 16

This day came with light winds
No. 141 from the NW steering by the wind
No saw land or ice passed close
to it on our beam the middle part
the wind hauled to the NE steering
NW by N the weather thick and rainy
at 4 AM the wind hauled to the NW by N
where ship steering NW by N took
in the fore-sail and mainsail and
close reefed the topsail
so ends these 24 hours

December 1854 ^{off Cape Horn}
Barge Cachalot at Sea
Wednesday 20

This day came with a moderate
breeze from the NW by steering
NW by N the middle and latter part
the wind and weather much the same
so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 21

This day commenced with strong
No. 142 winds from the NW at 4 AM the
wind hauled to the NW by tacked
ship to the NW the weather thick
and squally took in sail to
close reefed topsails the middle
and latter part the wind and weather
much the same so ends these 24 hours

Long 80 21 W

Friday 22

This day commenced with light
No. 144 winds from the NE steering NW
the middle part the wind from the
NE and rainy steering NW by N at 8 AM
the wind hauled to the NW by N
took in the ship to the NW so ends
these 24 hours
